

## Stoney Middleton Cave Index

### Introduction

Some classics, a good number of sporting through trips, another missing master-cave and some real grot. Figure out what's what and what's where and you'll be in for some good caving. For the exploratory caver there is still good potential for further discovery. This index details the major caves, mines, digs and some smaller sites of interest. There are however, hundreds of other natural cave entrances, features, old mines and mine shafts in this area which are not generally frequented by cavers and as yet, not listed here. See the end of this guide for information regarding the submission of additions and amendments.

Cave locations have been derived from non Differential GPS and the accuracy has been limited to 5m +/-2m due to satellite reception difficulties under the dense tree cover and sheer cliffs. Difficult marks have been confirmed or refined by triangulation from projected points using a Leica Disto A3 Laser Range Finder and Suunto KB Compass & Clinometer.

### Bamforth Hole

**Description:** The cave is situated in a buttress high up on a ledge on the north side of Stoney Dale. A short walking passage leads to a junction. To the left the roof soon lowers becoming impossibly tight. To the right is a

stoop and then crawl through a drafty tube emerges in daylight on the west side of the cliff.

### Calver Sough (Garden Shaft)

Depth: -6m, Length: 20m.

Access: The site is in a private garden and there is no access.

**Description:** The site is in the back garden of a converted corn mill in Calver village. A 1.5m shaft was dropped 10m into Calver sough and the sough dammed to provide water for the mill race. At -2m the water welled up through rubble but this was dug out (1991) to -4m accessing a short rubble slope down into the open sough, 1.5m wide by 2.5m high. This has been dived for 20m to a point where fallen stemples blocked the way on. This section of the sough is in a very poor state of repair, with fallen stemples and stonework exposing unstable eroded shale. Fine tailings soon reduce vis to zero. Further progress at this site does not look practical. Calver sough drains Coombs Dale and Longstone and Hassop Edges, the shafts further up the sough are either inaccessible or lost for various reasons.

Shaft in the floor after 20m (care!) and intersects natural solution passage in the wall to the right at this point. A careful step over the shaft into the passage passes a tight squeeze on the right almost immediately, behind which is a small chamber. Continuing on back in the natural passage, a short trend left leads down a series of short slides through small chambers to end abruptly in a sandy dig after about 25m.

### Eyam Dale House Cave

Length: 320m, Depth: 56m.  
Access: The cave lies in the grounds of Eyam Dale House Residential Home and it is advisable to book access in advance. Tel 01433 631360 or write to Eyam Dale House Residential Home, Church Street, Eyam, Hope

Valley, Derbyshire, S32 5QH. The other option is to call on the day to ask for permission. A key required and you may be asked to sign an indemnity and make a donation to the home. Proof of Public Liability Insurance is required.

**Description:** A 15m abseil down a mined shaft leads to a small chamber with an unstable mine level. Continuing on past a blind shaft in the floor leads through a constriction, followed by a slide down into small chamber to the right. From here another constriction leads into a rift, a little way along which, up and over a boulder pile leads to a bridged downclimb into the floor of the rift. Continuing on for a distance leads to a dead end in a large chamber, while back at the base of the downclimb, through a very tight, wet and muddy 'grovel' is the way on. After a short distance a very tight calcite restriction is met: 'The Pearly Gates'. On and to the right soon opens out and before long a tricky downclimb leads into a large rift chamber ahead. Immediately to the left closes down into a breakdown chamber, but just beyond over a cemented bolder pile, also on the left, is a short passage to some majestic formations, including floating calcite (do not disturb the water!). Under the cemented bolder pile is another way on, leading to a promising dig in the direction of the Dynamite Series in Carlsark Cavern. Back and to the right at the rift chamber the rift can be followed at various levels depending upon you head for heights.

In most cases the names or numbers given to these sites are not original or historic but are those used by cavers to for ease of identification.

There is a middle "entrance", hence the name, but this is too tight to get in or out of, unless you're a snake. Moving carefully through the entrances (which have become a bit of toilet for rock climbers) the cliff proper is entered. Ignoring a mined out hollow to the left there is almost immediately a small constriction with muddy puddle. Passing this a slight accent is made to a junction. The way on is right which

continues into an unstable mine level. Back slightly on the left is a natural passage, which is followed right and down a couple of muddy slides, then left to ascend through a constriction into two interconnected chambers.

**Description:** A fine sough in relatively good condition. Even in normal conditions the flow of water can be difficult to progress against in some of the narrower and lower sections. 1.6km in iron ladders ascend 15m into Glebe Mine, connecting to Ladywash Mine and the Hucklow Level. In normal conditions this is the main resurgence for the mines and caves of the Stoney Middleton and Eyam area. The Glebe Mine Winding Shaft has now been capped with concrete and is within a housing development.
